UNDISCOVERED AFRICA

Think you know Africa? A trip to **Bale Mountains National Park** in central Ethiopia will make you think again. Divided into five distinct habitats that include grasslands, woodlands, and the fairy-tale-like Harenna forest, the park is home to such rare animals as Ethiopian wolves and black-maned lions. The area is finally more accessible thanks to a new road and the opening of Bale Mountain Lodge, a high-end 15-room hotel with an in-house naturalist and a London-trained chef.
