## Do you want to go to the ends of the earth?

If it's remote and off the grid, requires multiple modes of transport and has unspoiled and untrammellled vistas, then it's the place for you.

Only whales have a better view of the remote North Atlantic than the Fogo Island Inn, a strikingly modernist structure perched on the rocky coast of Fogo Island off the coast of Newfoundland. From each of the 29 swanky suites, all decorated by local carpenters and craftspeople, you'll see whales, icebergs, all kinds of seabirds and the endless horizon, where sea and sky meet. fogoislandinn.ca

Sitting at a much warmer latitude, Ariara Island in the Philippines' Calamian Islands is a private retreat of the first order, with white-sand beaches, lush vegetation and palm trees, all lapped by crystal clear waters. The main lodge and villas accommodate up to 18 guests per week, and the 30 staff include dive instructors, a spa therapist and a chef. ariaraisland.com

The new Pikaia Lodge on Santa Cruz Island in the Galapagos means you can now stay in eco luxury in the heart of the national park.

Perched atop an extinct volcano crater near a private giant tortoise reserve, the lodge has an infinity pool, a spa, a yacht for day trips and a 35ft chartered fishing boat.

For a different type of cruise, step aboard the Aqua Mekong, launching in August, which will take you from Ho. Chi Minh City to the heart of Cambodia in true style. The 20 plush suites have floor-to-ceiling windows, the better to watch your progress from the vast Mekong Delta to Phnom Penh and Siem Reap. aquaexpeditions.com BA flies (via codeshare) to Manila, Guayaquil and Ho Chi Minh City from London Heathrow
